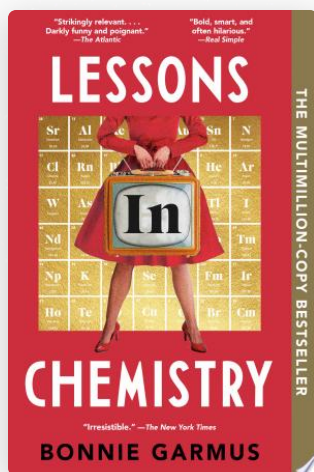

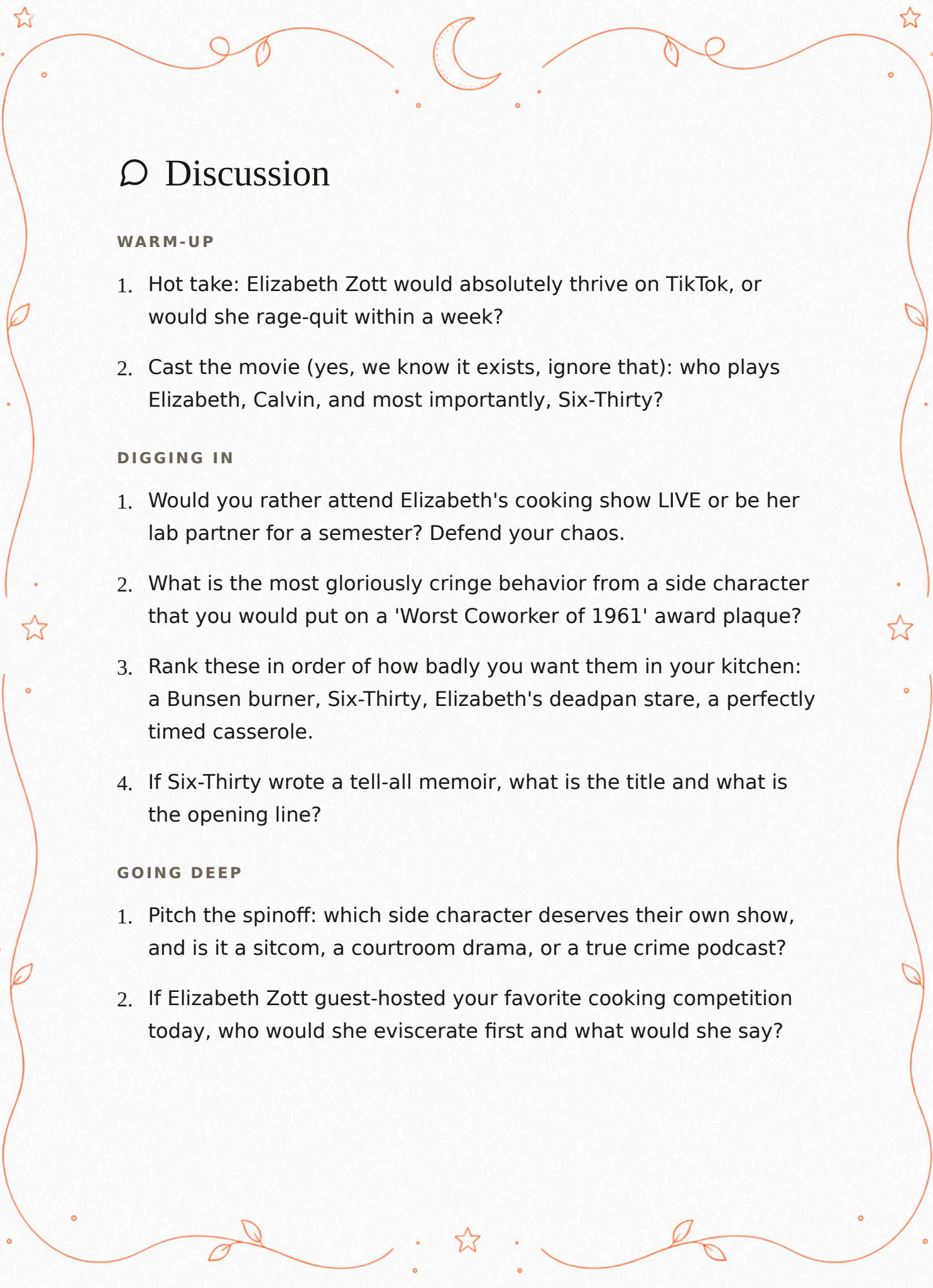
Supper at Six(ish): A Very Funny Book Club

Run trivia, then let everyone pitch their dream movie cast.

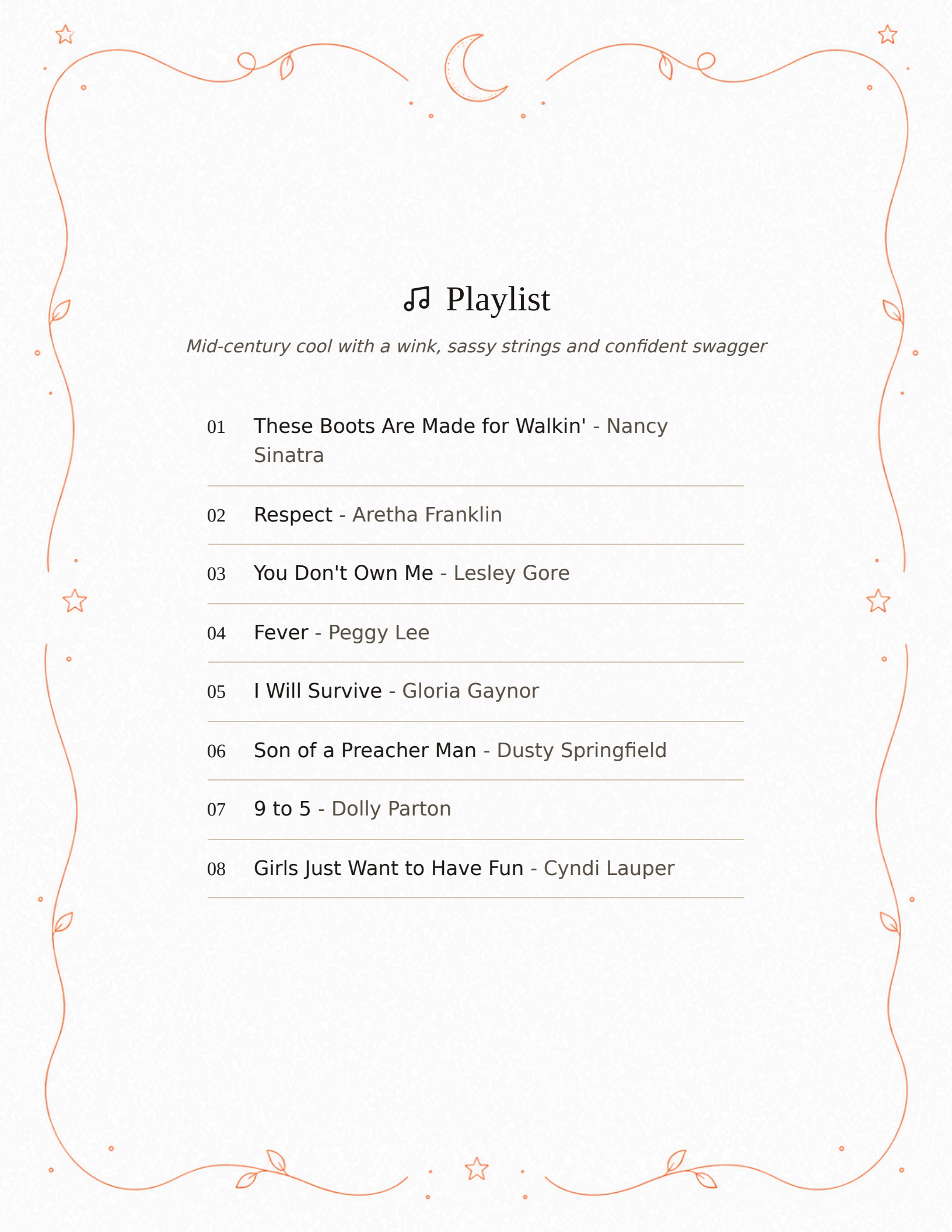
9:10

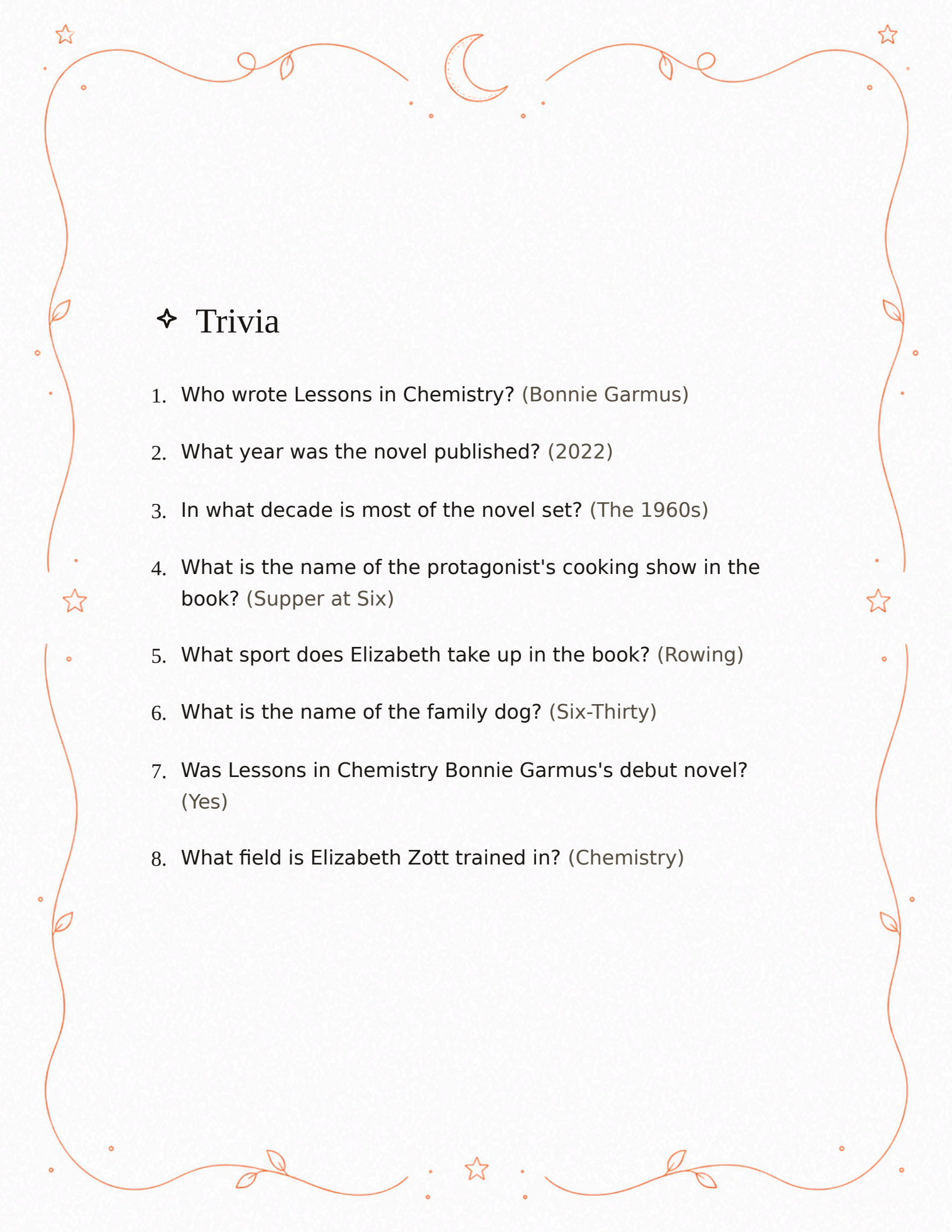

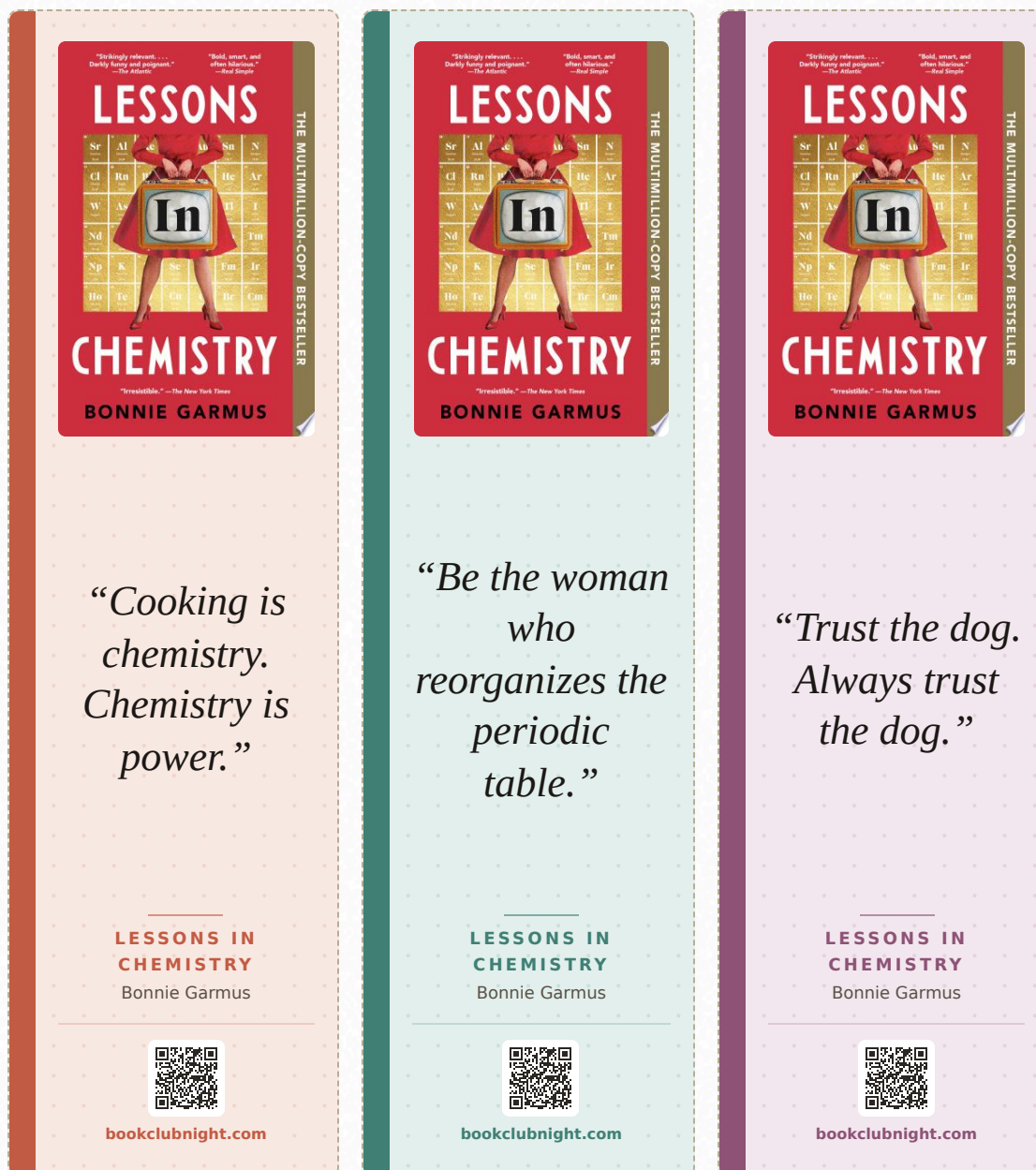
