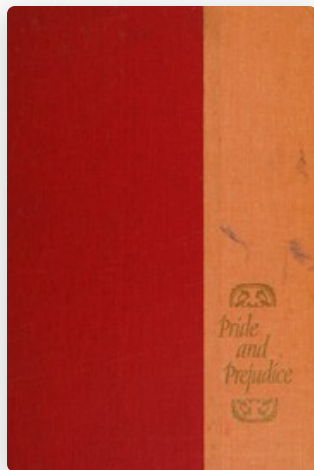

A witty, warm-hearted Regency romance about first impressions, family, and finding love in the most unexpected places. Perfect cozy comfort reading.

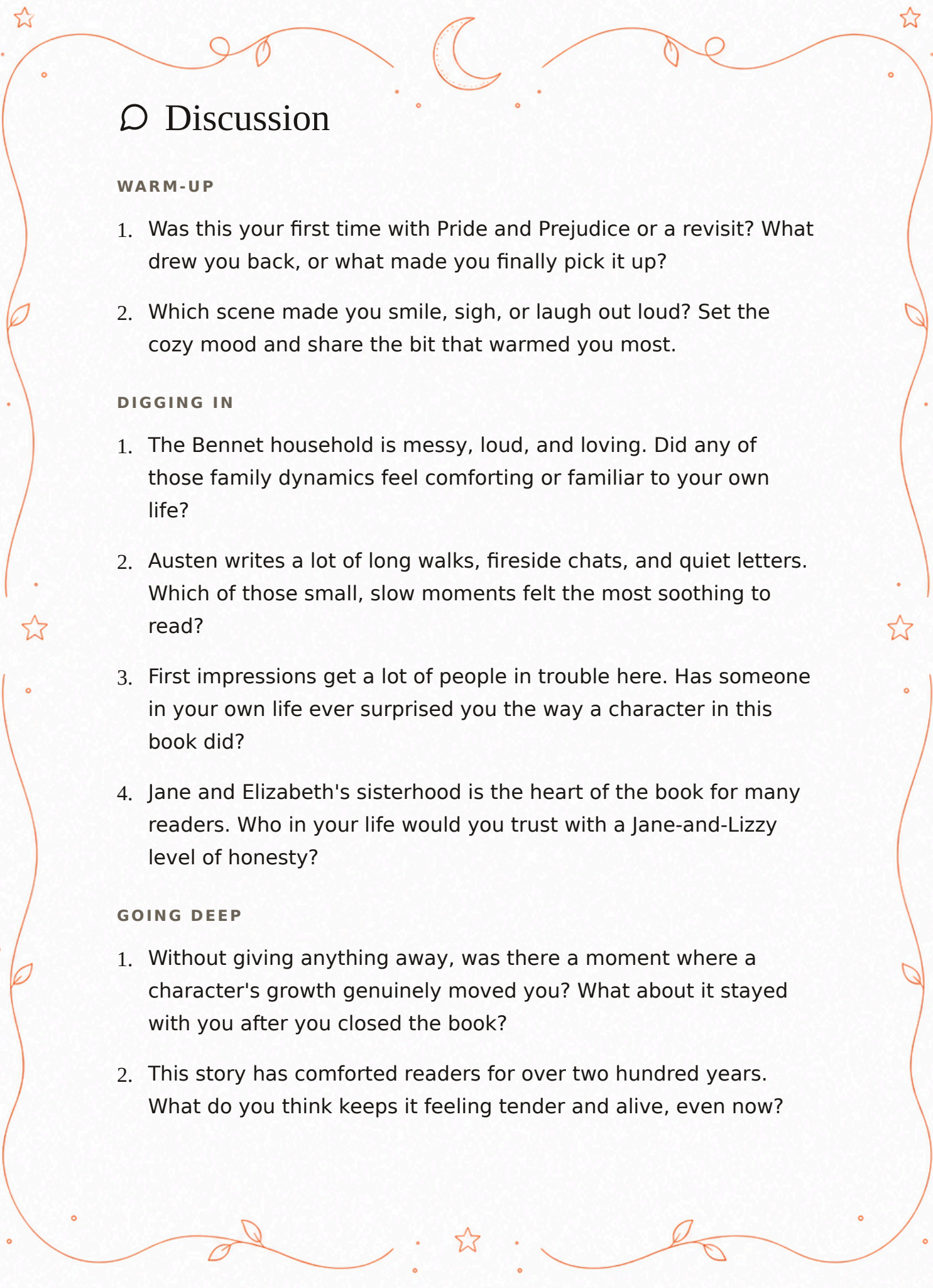
An Evening at Longbourn

Discussion

WARM-UP

1. Was this your first time with *Pride and Prejudice* or a revisit? What drew you back, or what made you finally pick it up?
2. Which scene made you smile, sigh, or laugh out loud? Set the cozy mood and share the bit that warmed you most.

DIGGING IN

1. The Bennet household is messy, loud, and loving. Did any of those family dynamics feel comforting or familiar to your own life?
2. Austen writes a lot of long walks, fireside chats, and quiet letters. Which of those small, slow moments felt the most soothing to read?
3. First impressions get a lot of people in trouble here. Has someone in your own life ever surprised you the way a character in this book did?
4. Jane and Elizabeth's sisterhood is the heart of the book for many readers. Who in your life would you trust with a Jane-and-Lizzy level of honesty?

GOING DEEP

1. Without giving anything away, was there a moment where a character's growth genuinely moved you? What about it stayed with you after you closed the book?
2. This story has comforted readers for over two hundred years. What do you think keeps it feeling tender and alive, even now?

TO EAT



Warm scones with clotted cream and jam

An English tea-table classic that fits Austen's drawing-room world and feels like a hug



Buttery shortbread biscuits

Simple, nostalgic, and perfect for nibbling between chapters of conversation



Cottage pie or a small pot of beef stew

Homey country fare that nods to Longbourn and warms a chilly evening

TO SIP



A proper pot of English breakfast tea (no alcohol)

Non-alcoholic and entirely Austen. Bring out the nicest cups you own.



Mulled apple cider (no alcohol)

Spiced, warm, and welcoming, like a fire at Pemberley



Elderflower and white wine spritz

Light, floral, and a touch celebratory, like a country ball in a glass



Run of show

7:00

Arrival and tea pour

Greet guests with a warm cup and let the playlist drift in the background

7:15

Cozy in, food first

Plates of scones and stew while people settle into blankets and armchairs

7:35

Warm-ups

Ease in with the two warm-up questions, no pressure to be clever

8:00

Heart of the chat

Move through the theme questions slowly, with refills encouraged

8:45

Deeper sip

Pour a fresh cup and try the deep questions by candlelight

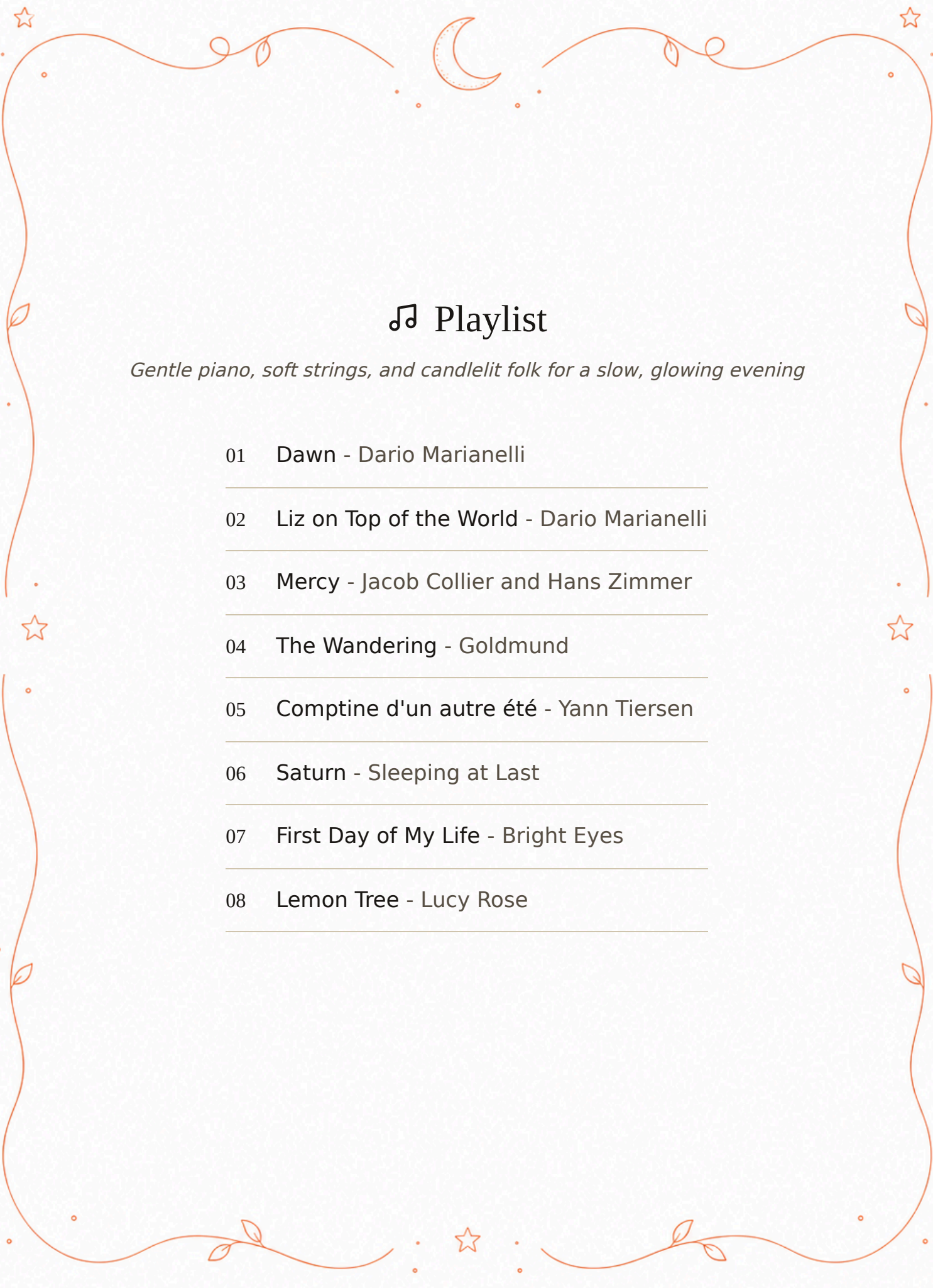
9:15

Trivia and scorecards

Wind down with light trivia, bookmarks to take home, and final ratings

HOST TIPS

- Lay out throws, cushions, and a few floor seats so no one feels they have to perch politely
- Keep the kettle going all night. Refilling cups gives shy guests a natural pause to jump in
- Pre-write the questions on cards so anyone can pick the next one, taking pressure off the host

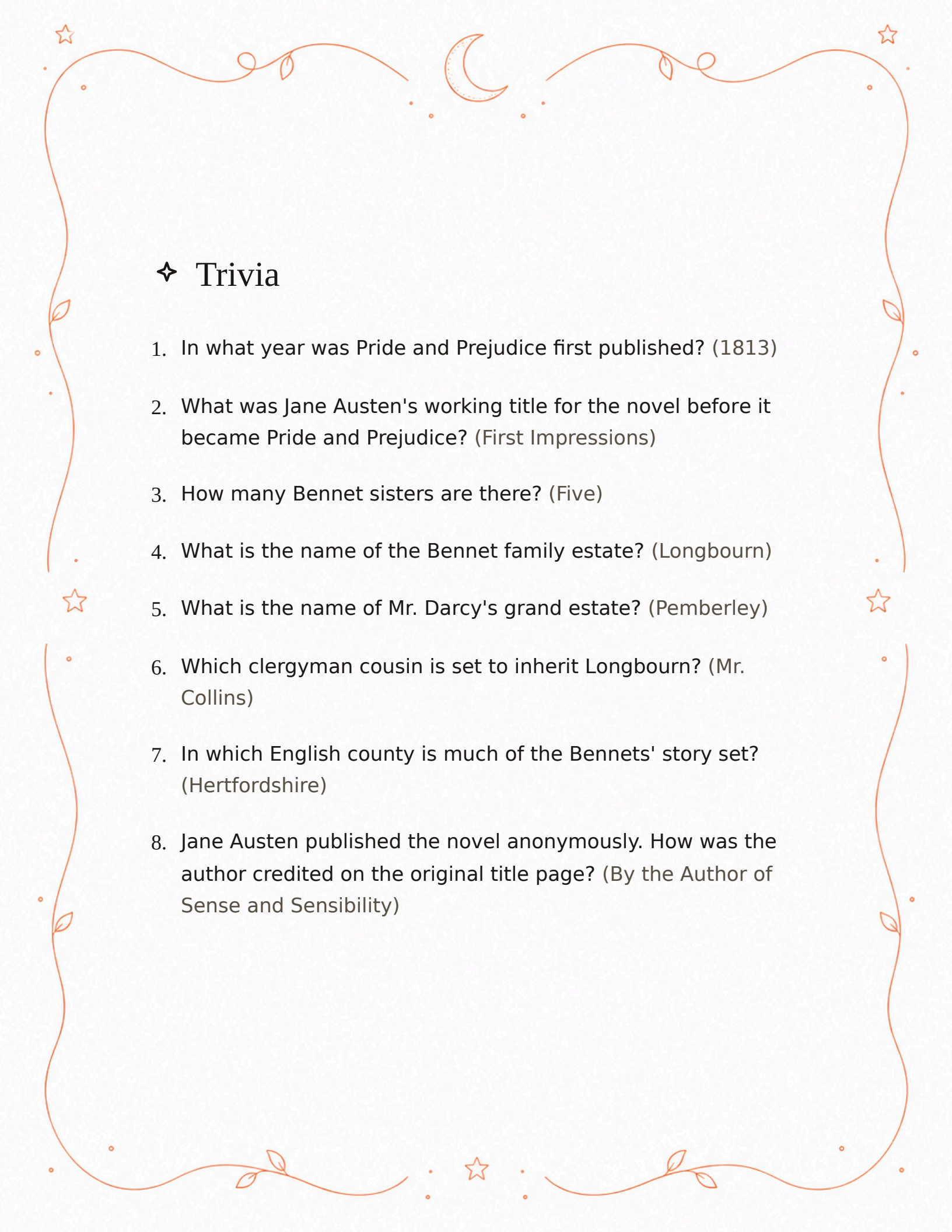
