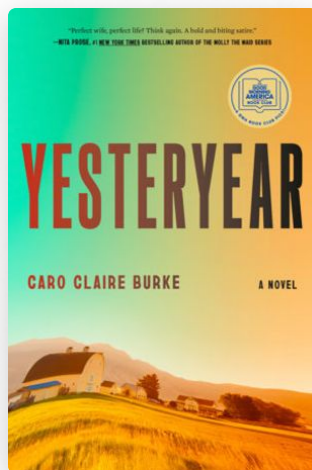

Discussion

WARM-UP

1. Where did you do most of your reading of *Yesteryear*, and did the book change the feel of that spot for you?
2. What was the first scene or image that made you settle in and think, okay, I am going to love spending time here?

DIGGING IN

1. The title itself promises nostalgia. What memory from your own life did the book gently surface that you had not thought about in a while?
2. Which character felt like someone you would want to make tea for, and what about them stirred that protective warmth?
3. Were there passages that felt like a soft place to land on a hard day? What about the writing offered that comfort?
4. Burke lingers in small, ordinary moments. Which quiet detail moved you more than you expected it to?

GOING DEEP

1. The book sits with the ache of looking backward. How did it leave you feeling about your own relationship with the past, lighter, heavier, or somewhere in between?
2. Without giving anything away, what feeling did you carry with you after closing the book, and how long did it stay with you?

A gentle nightcap for the wistful mood the book leaves behind

7:00

Soft arrivals

Greet guests with a warm mug in hand and let everyone settle into blankets and floor cushions

7:20

Comfort food spread

Serve the chicken and dumplings family-style so people pass bowls and chat

7:45

Warm-up circle

Open with the two warm-up questions, no pressure, just easing in

8:05

Heart of the conversation

Move through the theme questions slowly, pausing for tangents and memories

8:45

Dessert and deeper waters

Bring out the crumble and tea, then drift into the deep questions

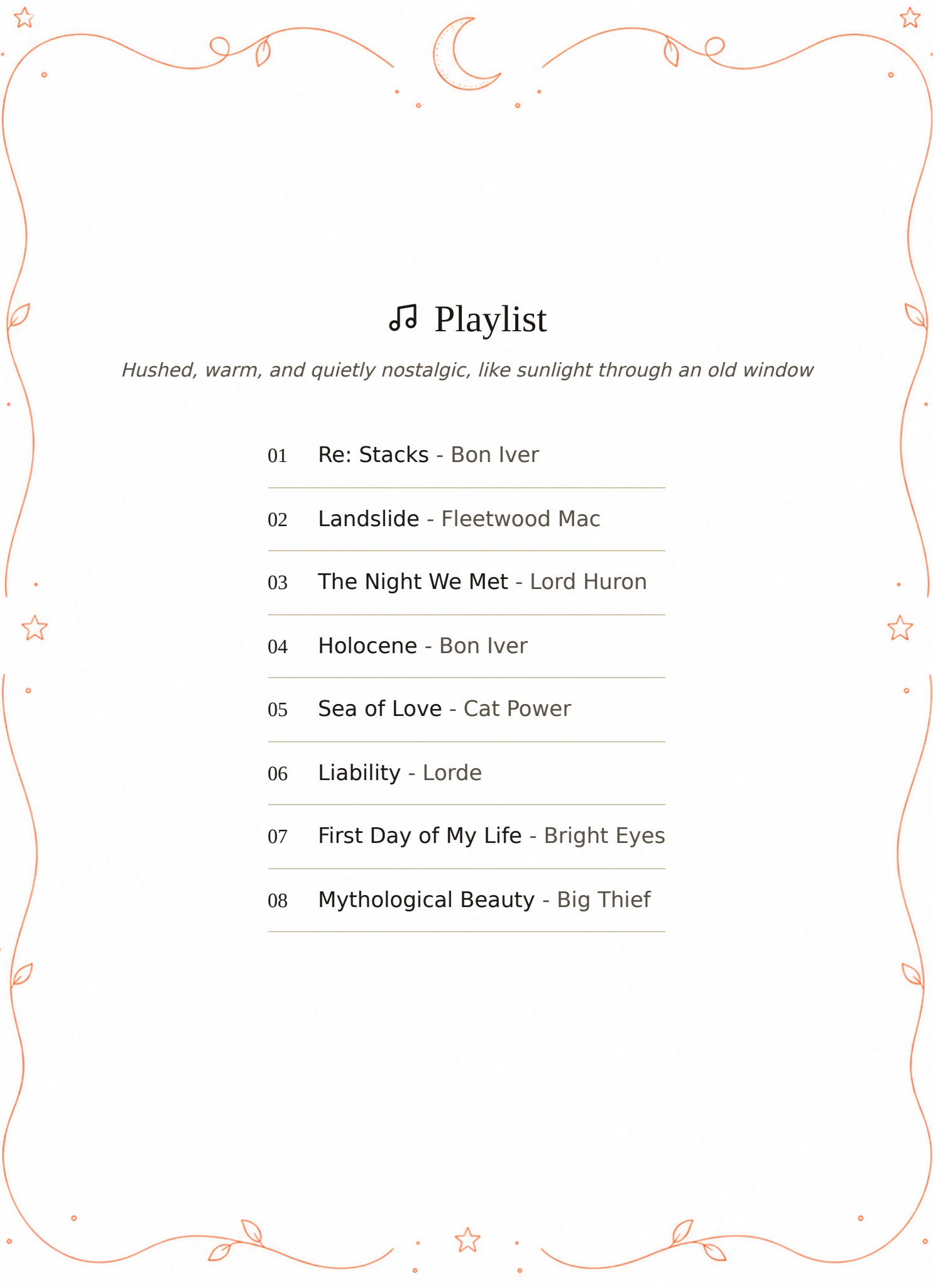
9:15

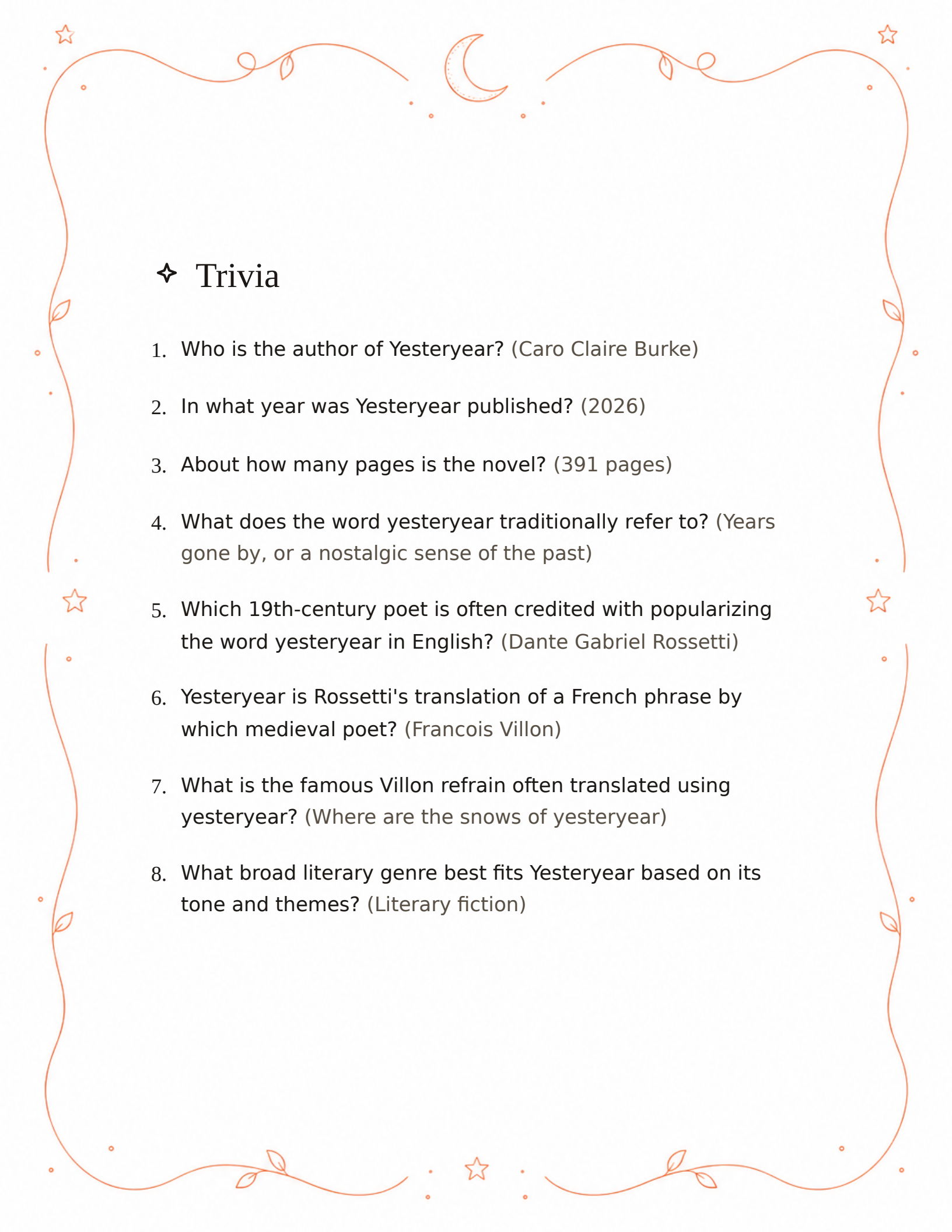
